

Romancing the Cape - Where two Oceans meet

Full Day 09:30 – 18:30



This is one of the premier tours around Cape Town, as it navigates the coastal route of the Cape Peninsula and National Park at its Southern tip, guardian of the unique Cape Floral Kingdom. The route takes us along the Atlantic coastline, past Camps Bay beach and Hout Bay. We drive along the scenic and famous Chapman's Peak Drive and continue past Misty Cliffs and Scarborough, heading for the highlight of the tour at the lighthouse at Cape Point where the Atlantic and Indian Oceans meet. We continue to the Boulders Penguin Colony – home to approximately 2000 breeding pairs of the endangered African Penguin, before crossing the Southern Peninsula to Cape Point Vineyards for lunch and afternoon overlooking Noordhoek Beach and the Atlantic Ocean in the distance. We return to the hotel via the "Ou Kaapse Weg" mountain pass at about 18h30.

The tour includes:

- English speaking guide
- Transport in a luxury air-conditioned vehicle
- Entrance to Cape Point Nature Reserve
